With the Jeanneau 64 Briand has delivered a modern hull for smooth and fast sailing, superior stability, and a greater interior volume as befits the flagship of the fleet.

The styling is tastefully nautical and contemporary. It feels smart and special, and pulls off the grace of a superyacht.”
